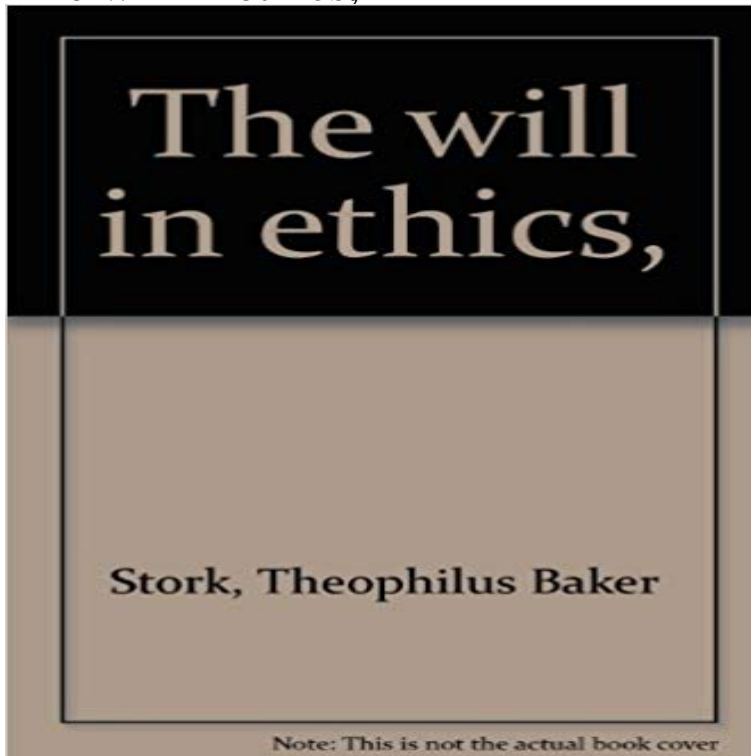


## The will in ethics,
